The Deputy Superintendent must act with integrity; support organizational goals; demonstrate the ability to inspire, grow, and motivate others; utilize feedback, drive for results, and commit to championing the needs of the students, employees, and District

overall.

- Work with the Superintendent, Board, and District leaders in oversight of designated areas in a fiscally responsible manner.

Home to one of the nation's only K-12 International Baccalaureate campuses, our district is also proud to have six National Blue-Ribbon Schools – a trademark of excellence and a symbol of quality noted by everyone from families to policymakers. We also have eight National Green Ribbon Schools, selected for exemplary efforts to reduce environmental impact and utility costs, promote better health, and ensure effective environmental education, including civics and green career pathways.
